What you could study at CapU

Bachelor programs you can take as an exchange or visiting international student include:

- <u>Business</u> (including marketing, accounting, finance, international business and human resources)
- <u>Communication Studies</u>
- <u>Liberal Arts</u> (including art history, anthropology, criminology, English 100-level courses*, geography, history, philosophy, political science, psychology and social sciences)
- <u>Tourism Management</u> (Cross Cultural Tourism, Destination Canada, Special Events, Conference Services, Tourism Operations, Environmental Stewardship, Contemporary Topics Shaping Tourism- A Global Perspective, Tourism and Climate Change, Tourism Planning and Policy)

These are not the only courses; but are ones that are excellent for visiting students.

Students are welcome to mix and match courses within these disciplines. Courses outside these subject areas are limited; seats are available upon approval. <u>View our programs and</u> <u>courses</u> for more information on these programs and their prerequisites. Most importantly, if you are currently studying in an institution abroad, you are responsible in taking the necessary steps to ensure your credits earned at CapU are transferrable back to your home institution, if that is your intention. It is strongly recommended that you do this before you arrive in Canada.

*To take an English 100-level course, you must submit a TOEFL or IELTS score that satisfies the <u>course pre-requisites</u>.
