Proposed enrolment at UTS subject choices

You are required to select at least 18 UTS credit points (usually 3 subjects) worth of subjects that you plan to study at UTS. A lot of students take 24 credits (usu. 4 subjects) to fulfil requirements (course/grade transfer) from their home universities. Note that most subjects are worth 6 credit points, however, subjects in the Faculty of Arts and Sciences (excluding the School of Education) are usually worth 8 credit points.

It is preferable that you list at least 6 subjects per semester but no more than 10 in total to provide alternative options.

Subjects as a Study Abroad and Exchange Student also shows you how to use the $\underline{\sf UTS}$ $\underline{\sf Timetable\ Planner}$.

Is the subject undergraduate or postgraduate?

Undergraduate subjects (Bachelor's degree level) and postgraduate subjects (Master's degree level) are available to Study Abroad and Exchange students. If you have not completed the equivalent of an Australian Bachelor's degree (e.g. 180 ECTS), you will not be able to undertake postgraduate subjects.

What if the subjects have prerequisites?

If a subject has prerequisites, you must demonstrate that you have the required knowledge to take the subject based on previous studies. You will need to supply detailed subject outlines (in English) of the subjects you have already completed at your home institution.

Will the subject be credited to my degree?

When selecting subjects, it is important to keep in mind how you will use them for credit at your home institution. Always check with your home institution's Study Abroad or Exchange academic adviser regarding the suitability of your subject selections.

Is the subject offered during the right teaching session for me? You can check when subjects are available by referring to the <u>UTS timetable</u> (https://timetable.uts.edu.au). Some subjects are offered only in Autumn session or Spring session, but not in both. Details of subjects are available in the <u>UTS Handbook</u>. The <u>Step-by-Step Guide to Finding Subjects as a Study Abroad and Exchange Student</u> (PDF, 3MB) shows you how to use the UTS Timetable Planner.

Please Note:

- Enrolment in your chosen subject(s) is not guaranteed.
- Enrolment is dependent on the student meeting the requirements for the subject, on the subject being available in the chosen semester and successful timetabling of classes.
- The UTS timetable for the full academic year is finalized no earlier than October in the prior year. If you are selecting subjects for the next academic year prior to October (e.g. it is September 2021 and you are applying for Autumn 2022), you must use the current academic year (e.g. 2021) handbook and timetable as a guide. There is no guarantee subjects offered in the current academic year will be offered in the following academic year. All subject approvals will be conditional until the timetable is officially released.

TERMS AND CONDITIONS

Academic transcripts of previous studies

Certified transcripts of previous studies must accompany this application. If the original certified copy is not in English, you must include certified English language translations also. The transcripts must show all subjects taken, grades (including fails) and stages reached or qualifications gained. A collection of examination slips is not an acceptable substitute for an official transcript.

You must provide full details if you have been excluded or are liable for exclusion from any institution. As there is a long delay at some institutions in obtaining official transcripts you should apply for transcripts as soon as possible. Your application will not be processed unless all necessary information has been provided.

English language proficiency

You must provide a recent English language test score or proof of previous study in English. If your test results are below the acceptable standard, you will not be eligible to study at UTS.

Payment of fees for Study Abroad and Research students

The scheduled fee for the first semester's tuition is based on an 18-24 credit point program of study, and is payable upon acceptance of an offer from UTS. Tuition fees for subsequent semesters are due at the start of each semester. Tuition fees are for the current year only and may be subject to annual increase. You will be required to pay the Study Abroad fees applicable to the academic year in which you will be enrolled.

Fee refund for Study Abroad and Research students

Refunds will only be considered under the terms of the current UTS Fees Policy for International Students. If you withdraw after you have accepted the offer of a place you may incur a penalty.
